Bishop: God has come to us as a child, to dwell with us, and to walk with us. (Light the Christ Candle in your Advent wreath, often a candle in the center.)

All: May the light and the fire from these candles burn away whatever would prevent the God of hope, peace joy, and love from being born among us. As friends and followers of Jesus, let us not be afraid for even now — even now — the light of Christ is illuminating the world, on earth as it is in heaven! Amen.




