PRESIDENT: We give thanks to you Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets: and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent Him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In Him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. 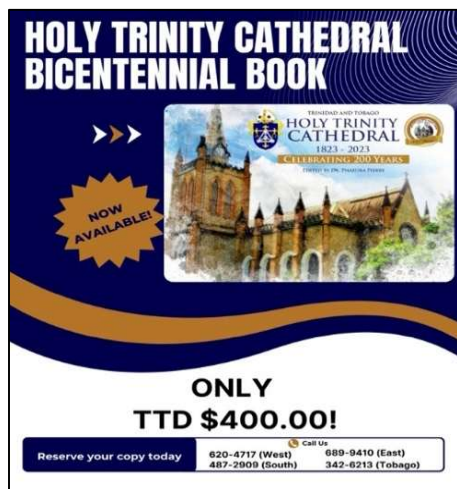

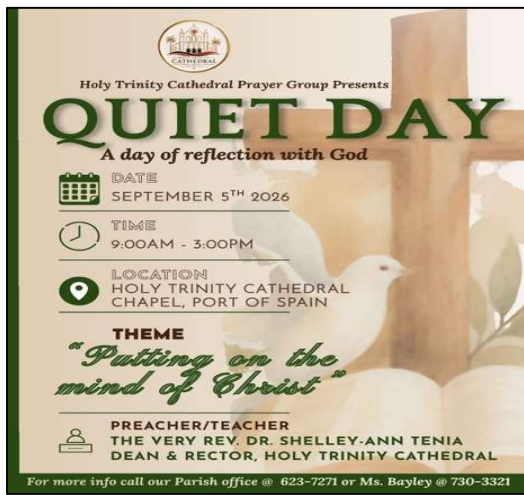

1. CHECK VISIBILITY
 Ensure the extinguisher is visible, unobstructed and easily accessible.

2. CHECK PIN & SEAL
 Make sure the safety pin is in place and tamper seal is intact.

3. CHECK PRESSURE GAUGE
 The needle should be in the green zone.
 ✓
- 
4. CHECK FOR DAMAGE
 Look for dents, leaks, rust, or any physical damage.
 ✓
- 
5. CHECK HOSE & NOZZLE
 Ensure the hose is not cracked, blocked or damaged.
 ✓
- 
6. CHECK INSPECTION TAG
 Verify the inspection tag is present and up to date.
 ✓
- 
7. CHECK APPROPRIATENESS
 Ensure the extinguisher is the correct type for the hazard.
 ✓
- 
8. CHECK ACCESS
 Ensure nothing is blocking access to the extinguisher.
 ✓

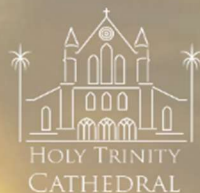
